5 Police Business A new 5-shift system was being introduced. There had been 10 thefts with enquiries ongoing; 5 house break-ins with enquiries ongoing; 8 breach-of-the-peace with 5 detected; 2 misuse of drugs with both detected; 4 vandalisms with 2 detected; and 2 road traffic offences. PC Emmerson said crime was down on the previous period. He said that Inspector James Hendrie from Dumfries& Galloway had been appointed. The Town Centre Street Pastors were proving helpful. North Ayrshire has had a new county policing system for 6 months. Fridays were not as busy as they used to be as some nightclubs were closed by 1.00am. Prestwick was busy on Friday and Saturday nights. He answered several questions.

6 Ayr Town Centre Renaissance There had been a presentation to SAC elected members showing an ambitious Master Plan with input from the architect Niall McLauchlin with Charles Jencks. It attracted a round of applause and would later be shown to the public.

Work was to start soon on the former Clydesdale Bank building.
