The report provides Ayr South October 2019 and 2019 crime figures for comparison purposes. Housebreakings in the Ayr South Ward have increased by 3 compared with the same period last year. Car crime has decreased by 2 in Ayr South during this period. Residents should be highly vigilant regarding home security and leaving items visible in their cars and ensuring central locking

systems are engaged correctly. Anyone seen acting suspiciously should be reported to police immediately.

Chief Inspector Brian Anderson is continuing to visit the community councils.

It was reportedly quieter along the Esplanade lately. There was a repeat request for monitoring the 20mph limit in Dalblair Road.

Incidents of anti-social behaviour with youths damaging property were brought to attention. In Possil Park, door bells were rung for a lark, with accomplice lying in the road to lure householders outside.
